movement is an amnesiac: socialists know little about where they are coming from, no wonder they hardly know where they are going. The fact is that little work or publication goes on in the field by socialists; most is by non-socialists or anti-socialists. They too can serve; but socialists' concern with their own history is not of an academic character. A living movement has to know the lessons of the past.
